A BILL

To require persons seeking approval for a liquefied natural gas facility to identify employees and agents engaged in activities to persuade communities of the benefits of the approval.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. IDENTIFICATION OF PROPONENTS OF AP-**
4 **PROVAL OF LIQUIFIED NATURAL GAS FACILI-**
5 **TIES.**

6 (a) LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS FACILITIES REQUIR-
7 ING FERC APPROVAL.—The Federal Energy Regulatory
8 Commission shall—

1 (1) require an applicant for approval, by the
2 Commission under the Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C.
3 717 et seq.), of the siting, construction, expansion,
4 or operation of a liquefied natural gas facility to
5 identify each of the employees and agents of the ap-
6 plicant that are engaged, directly or indirectly, in ac-
7 tivities to persuade communities of the benefits of
8 the approval; and

9 (2) maintain a publicly available database list-
10 ing the names of the employees and agents.

11 (b) OFF-SHORE LIQUIFIED NATURAL GAS FACILI-
12 TIES.—The Secretary of Transportation and the Secretary
13 of the department in which the Coast Guard is operating
14 shall—

15 (1) require an applicant for approval, by the ap-
16 propriate Secretary under the Deepwater Port Act
17 of 1974 (33 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.), of the siting, con-
18 struction, expansion, or operation of a liquefied nat-
19 ural gas facility to identify each of the employees
20 and agents of the applicant that are engaged, di-
21 rectly or indirectly, in activities to persuade commu-
22 nities of the benefits of the approval; and

23 (2) maintain a publicly available database list-
24 ing the names of the employees and agents.
