SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2412 by Representative Mast

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2412 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2412 would allow for the suspension of a driver's license for unlawful use of a driver's license, furnishing alcohol to minors, and knowingly hosting minors who possess or consume alcohol. The suspensions would be in addition to misdemeanor criminal penalties. The suspension would be for 180 days for a first conviction and one year for the second or subsequent convictions.

The Department of Revenue states that HB 2412 would have a negligible effect on State Highway Fund revenues. The agency's Driver Control Bureau would have to establish three new conviction and withdrawal codes, and programming changes to the driver's license system would be needed. The agency estimates a need for 160 hours of contract programming at a cost of \$12,800. Inclusion of the new codes into monthly and yearly statistics and revision of the traffic code sheet would also be necessary. The agency states that an increase in the Bureau's



workload for the new convictions is expected, but a fiscal effect cannot be estimated without knowing how many additional convictions would occur.
