

1.1 A resolution

1.2 memorializing Congress; requesting Congress to acknowledge that the neurological
1.3 disorder known as Parkinson's disease can be caused by exposure to Agent Orange
1.4 and to require that the United States Department of Veterans Affairs offer assistance
1.5 to United States military members who, while serving their country, have acquired
1.6 Parkinson's disease through their exposure to Agent Orange.

1.7 WHEREAS, Agent Orange was an herbicide used in Vietnam to kill unwanted plants and
1.8 to remove leaves from trees that otherwise provided cover for the enemy. After its use, it was
1.9 realized that Agent Orange contained dioxin, which is related to a number of diseases, cancers,
1.10 and other disorders. Many United States veterans are known to have been exposed to significant
1.11 amounts of Agent Orange while fulfilling their military obligations; and

1.12 WHEREAS, as required by law, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)
1.13 recognizes many diseases as being associated with Agent Orange, including chloracne, acute
1.14 peripheral neuropathy, and numerous cancers such as Hodgkin's disease, multiple myeloma, and
1.15 prostate cancer. Veterans who served in Vietnam between January 9, 1962, and May 7, 1975, and
1.16 who acquire one of the recognized diseases are entitled to VA-furnished hospital care, medical
1.17 services, and possibly nursing home care; and

1.18 WHEREAS, several studies performed at internationally recognized research institutions,
1.19 including St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, have linked Parkinson's disease to Agent Orange
1.20 and other pesticides. Research work at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital linked genetic
1.21 alterations associated with an increased risk of Parkinson's disease to pesticide exposures; and

1.22 WHEREAS, the Department of Veterans Affairs Regional Office in Winston-Salem, North
1.23 Carolina, has determined in two cases that the Parkinson's disease of veterans could have been
1.24 caused by their contact with Agent Orange while on active military duty; NOW, THEREFORE,

2.1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota that Congress should

2.11 Department of Veterans Affairs.
