HOUSE BILL NO. 430

BY REPRESENTATIVE PETERSON

ETHICS: Repeals provision for recusal for members of the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans and removes provisions permitting certain persons to serve on the board

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 34:1(A)(3) and R.S. 42:1112(D) and to repeal R.S. 42:1120.1
3 and 1123(8), relative to the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans; to
4 repeal recusal provisions for members of the Board of Commissioners of the Port of
5 New Orleans; to remove provisions allowing certain individuals to serve as members
6 of the board; and to provide for related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. R.S. 34:1(A)(3) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

9 §1. Continuation; qualifications; appointments; terms; vacancies

12 (3) All members shall be experienced in the commerce or industry, or both,
13 of the port area, and shall otherwise possess the qualifications prescribed by law.
14 ~~Notwithstanding any prohibition contained in Part II of Chapter 15 of Title 42 of the~~
15 ~~Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, individuals employed in the maritime industry~~
16 ~~may serve as members hereunder.~~ The present members, seven in number, shall
17 continue to serve on the board for the duration of their respective terms.

1 Section 2. R.S. 42:1112(D) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

2 §1112. Participation in certain transactions involving the governmental entity

3 * * *

4 D. No appointed member of any board or commission, except as otherwise
5 provided in R.S. 42:~~1120.1~~, 1120.2; or 1120.3, shall participate or be interested in
6 any transaction involving the agency when a violation of this Part would result.

7 Section 3. R.S. 42:1120.1 and 1123(8) are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Abstract: Removes ethics code recusal provision for members of the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans and removes provision specifying that persons employed in the maritime industry may serve as members of the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans.

Present law (ethics code) prohibits any board or commission member, immediate family member, or legal entity in which he has a controlling interest from bidding on or entering into a contract or other transaction under the supervision or jurisdiction of the board or commission. Present law additionally prohibits any public servant from participating in a transaction in which he has a substantial economic interest which involves the governmental entity. Further prohibits any public servant from such participation if any of the following have a substantial economic interest:

- (1) Any member of his family.
- (2) Any person in which he has a substantial economic interest.
- (3) Any person of which he is an officer, director, trustee, partner, or employee.
- (4) Any person with whom he is negotiating or has an arrangement concerning prospective employment.
- (5) Any person who is a party to an existing contract with the public servant, or with a legal entity in which he owns in excess of 25%, or who owes any thing of economic value to him, or to any legal entity in which he controls or exercises an interest in excess of 25%, and who is in a position to affect directly the economic interests of the public servant.

Present law prohibits any appointed member of any board or commission from participating or being interested in any transaction involving the agency which would be a violation of the ethics code. Present law provides an exception for the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans and requires a member of the board to recuse himself from voting on matters which would otherwise violate the prohibited participation and prohibited contracts provisions of the ethics code.

Proposed law repeals the exception and the provision for recusal.

Present law (R.S. 42:1123(8)) provides that the ethics code does not preclude any individual employed in the maritime industry from serving as an appointed member of the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans. Present law (R.S. 34:1(A)(3)) additionally provides that, notwithstanding the ethics code, individuals employed in the maritime industry may serve as members of the board.

Proposed law removes these present law provisions.
