HOUSE BILL NO. 614

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Provides that it is a violation to engage in activities without a local permit

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 26:282 and to enact R.S. 26:274(F), relative to the alcoholic  
3 beverage control law; to provide that engaging in authorized activities without a local  
4 permit is a violation; to provide that a misstatement of fact in an application for any  
5 permit is grounds for denial of the permit; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 26:282 is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 26:274 (F) is  
8 hereby enacted to read as follows:

9 §274. Local permits

10 \* \* \*

11 F. It shall be a violation of this Chapter to engage in activities authorized  
12 herein without first obtaining a local permit from the parish or municipality where  
13 the business is located, if such a local permit is required.

14 \* \* \*

15 §282. Misstatement or suppression of fact in application

16 Any misstatement or suppression of fact in an application or accompanying  
17 affidavit for any permit provided for in this Chapter is a ground for the denial,  
18 withholding or suspension of a permit in the manner provided in this Chapter.

**Abstract:** Provides that engaging in authorized activities without a local permit is a violation and that a misstatement of fact in an application for any permit is grounds for denial of the permit.

Proposed law provides that it shall be a violation of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law to engage in authorized activities without first obtaining a local permit from the parish or municipality where the business is located, if such a local permit is required.

Present law provides that any misstatement or suppression of fact in an application or accompanying affidavit is a ground for the denial, withholding or suspension of a permit for dealers in beverages of low alcoholic content in the manner provided in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law.

Proposed law provides that any misstatement or suppression of fact in an application or accompanying affidavit for any permit provided for in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law is a ground for the denial, withholding or suspension of a permit.
