A BILL

To reinstate the Interim Management Strategy governing off-road vehicle use in the Cape Hatteras National Seashore, North Carolina, pending the issuance of a final rule for off-road vehicle use by the National Park Service.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. REINSTATEMENT OF INTERIM MANAGEMENT**
2 **STRATEGY.**

3 After the date of the enactment of this Act, Cape
4 Hatteras National Seashore shall be managed in accord-
5 ance with the Interim Protected Species Management
6 Strategy/Environmental Assessment issued by the Na-
7 tional Park Service on June 13, 2007, for the Cape Hat-
8 teras National Seashore, North Carolina, until the Na-
9 tional Park Service issues a special regulation and long-
10 term off-road vehicle management plan for the use of Cape
11 Hatteras National Seashore by the public.

12 **SEC. 2. INAPPLICABILITY OF CONSENT DECREE.**

13 The April 30, 2008, consent decree filed in the
14 United States District Court for the Eastern District of
15 North Carolina regarding off-road vehicle use at Cape
16 Hatteras National Seashore in North Carolina shall not
17 apply after the date of the enactment of this Act.
